METACOGNITION HAS REALLY GOT NORWOOD THINKING AGAIN THIS YEAR




You should be aware that over the last year we have been developed **metacognition** throughout the school. The aim for us was that we want our pupils to not only gain knowledge but also develop the skills to think about how they learn and how they can overcome problems. This is known as **metacognition**.

You may have even seen our Meta Learner dojo.

Metacognition is a big word for something most of us do every day without even noticing:

Reflecting on our own thoughts as this is how we gain an insight into our feelings, needs and behaviours - and then we can learn, manage and adapt to new experiences, challenges and emotional setbacks. It's the running conversation we have in our heads, mentally sounding ourselves out and making plans. Training children to use this proactively to overcome obstacles can be a powerful tool.



We have been helping the children understand and develop their own **resilience** through the 'Learning Pit'. This reminds us that new learning is difficult: we may feel like everybody else knows what they are doing and that we are

confused and a bit lost. It also reminds us this is a normal part of learning and with persistence, practice and effort we can climb out of the pit.

This half term we are encouraging the learning behaviour - **independence**.
