

- 1) **Award 1 mark** for all **three** correct.

Sentence	Past tense	Present tense
<i>Samir enjoys cooking.</i>		✓
<i>Eva laughed at the joke.</i>	✓

- 2) **Award 1 mark** for *couldn't* spelt correctly.

Example responses:
